VP of Ed

Just as all meeting roles are important (how many times have you seen that message in a program or in the Newsletter?) all offices are important. Each one is designed for a specific purpose – to help each member of Toastmasters become a better speaker and communicator.

How can you tell if the VP of Education is doing a good job? Here is the key to evaluating the VP of Education --

- The meeting begins and ends on time.
- All meeting participants arrive on time and are prepared.
- Members and guests alike are greeted as they arrive.
- Everyone is made to feel welcome.
- The program is fast-paced and enjoyable.
- Transitions between segments are smooth.
- All members present have an opportunity to participate.
- Evaluations are helpful and constructive.
- Members achievements are recognized.

Wow! Donna does all that? Yes. Although, some of it may be indirect. This is why the office, VP of Education, is critical to a Club's success. Donna -- Keep up the good work.

This is where the other shoe falls. (Shoes fall in pairs, Nuns travel in pairs, pears come in a can.) Each member of Northwestern Toastmasters must work with Donna in order for the Club to succeed. How, you ask? Just use common sense.

- If you know that you can't make a meeting, let her know as early as possible. It's always easier to make a schedule when you know who is going to be there. (Much easier than having to revise a schedule.)

- If some role makes you uncomfortable, then talk to Donna. She can see that you are not scheduled for that role until you are ready. She also has a list of Club members that will be happy to work with you and help you prepare for that role.

- If you would like to speak more often, let Donna know. She keeps a list of people that are able to fill in, at the last minute, with prepared speeches.

- The next time you see Donna – say "Thank You, for the great job you are doing."
