Back in the old days, before the Internet (when I was too young to join Toastmasters) Northwestern Toastmasters had a handout that was given to each new member. This handout contained a section for each role in a Toastmasters Meeting. Each section contained valuable information about performing that role - everything from where to stand, to suggestions to stand out.

When your meek, mild webmaster started setting up our web site (www.nwtm.org) he added this handout under the "Roles" tab on the left side of the web site. So, when you look at the schedule and see you have been assigned a role, don't panic. Don't think "Gosh! I don't know how to do that." Simply go to our web site and look up your role.
