How We Become Better Speakers

By repeating an action one makes the action more permanent, not more perfect. That is why good evaluations are so important to the continued speaking improvement of our members. We recently had a special fifth

Tuesday training session covering effective evaluations. Some of the keys to good evaluations covered:

- Preserving the self-esteem of the speaker through sincere compliments.
• Offering the speaker specific suggestions for cited "needs improvements."
• Recognizing the progress of the speaker.
• Understanding the difference between judging and evaluating.
• Starting positive and ending positive.

We were admonished not to:

- Spend those precious 2 minutes of evaluation time talking about ourselves.
• Using humor at the expense of the speaker.
• Nagging the speaker by excessive repetition of our points.

Our evaluators usually offer both sincere compliments and some suggestions for improvement. However, as evaluators we, too, need feedback if we wish to become better at this very important responsibility. The Toastmaster who should give that feedback is the General Evaluator. When you serve as General Evaluator be sure you cover the most important part of your job - evaluating the individual evaluators.

We can affect the effectiveness of our evaluations at each of our meetings by thoughtfully voting for best evaluator. When you vote for best evaluator ask not which evaluator was the most entertaining. Ask which evaluator most likely helped their speaker become a better speaker - walk a mile in the speaker's shoes if you like.

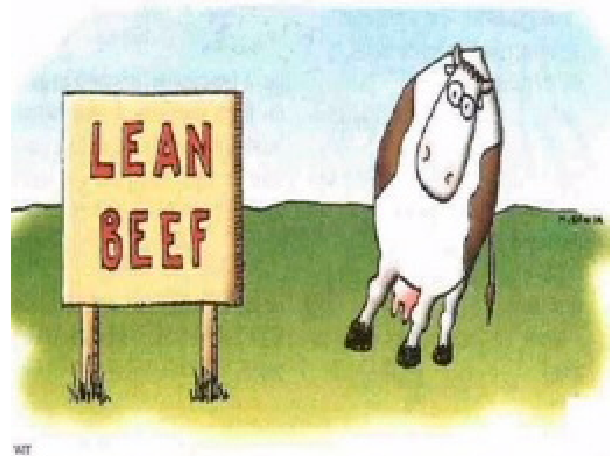
It's up to each of us as evaluator, voter, general evaluator, and speaker to insure that each of us continues to improve our speaking ability. We could also become better listeners and thinkers in the process!
